The ShellSPORT Merits Awards will again be presented this season. Introduced in 1976, the attractive Georgian tankard is presented for the most meritorious performance by a driver, official, crew or any other person or group associated with the meeting. The selection is made by a panel of judges representing the news media, the promoter and the sport of Motor Racing

In the past two seasons some 25 Awards have been made. Of these, 14 were presented for driving performances spread over most of the racing classes. A further six were awarded to track officials which included specific actions in crash and fire incidents. The remaining five went to service crews recognising their performances under extreme circumstances.

A ShellSPORT Merit Award will be made at this meeting after Event 17A.

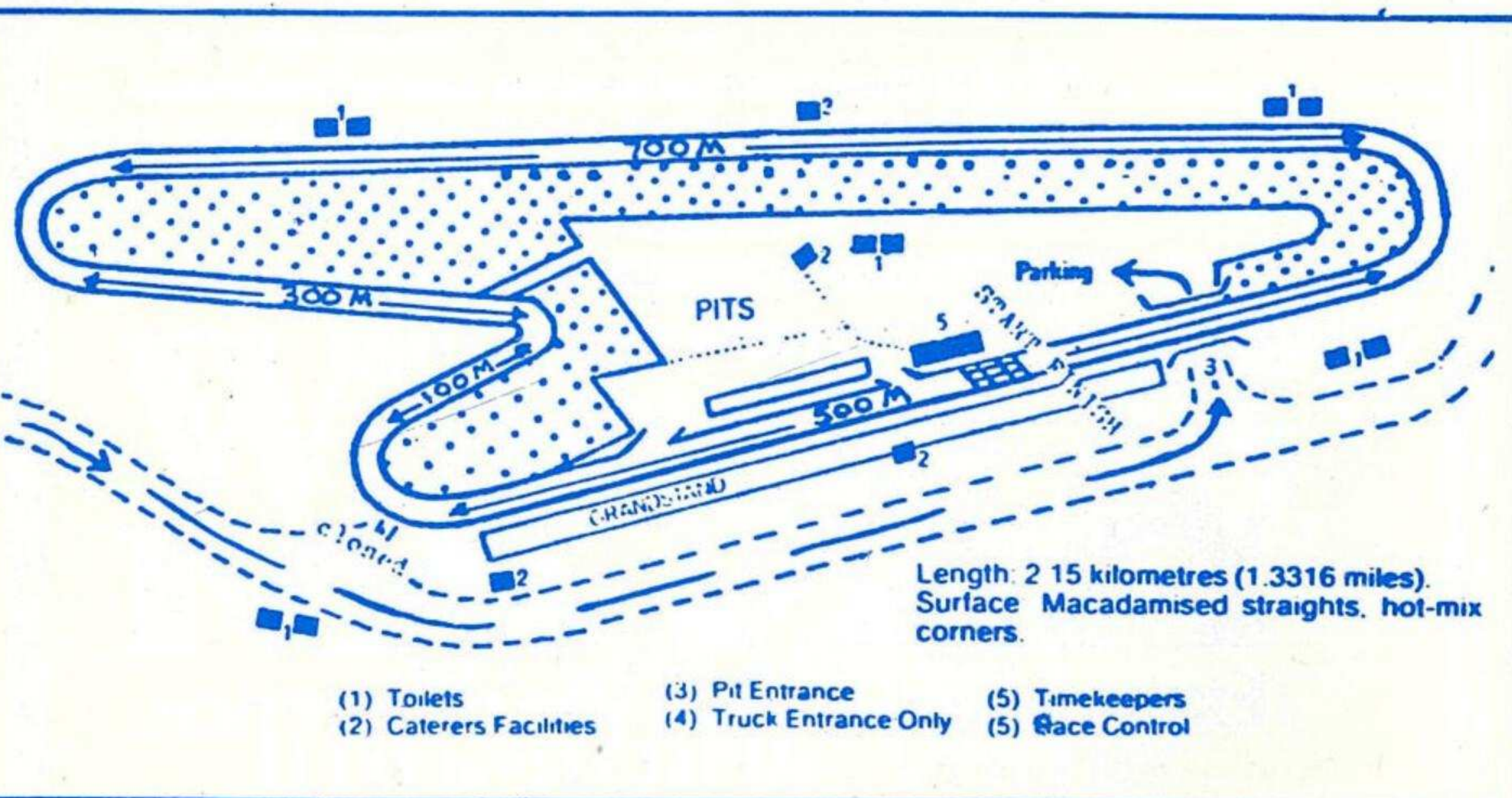

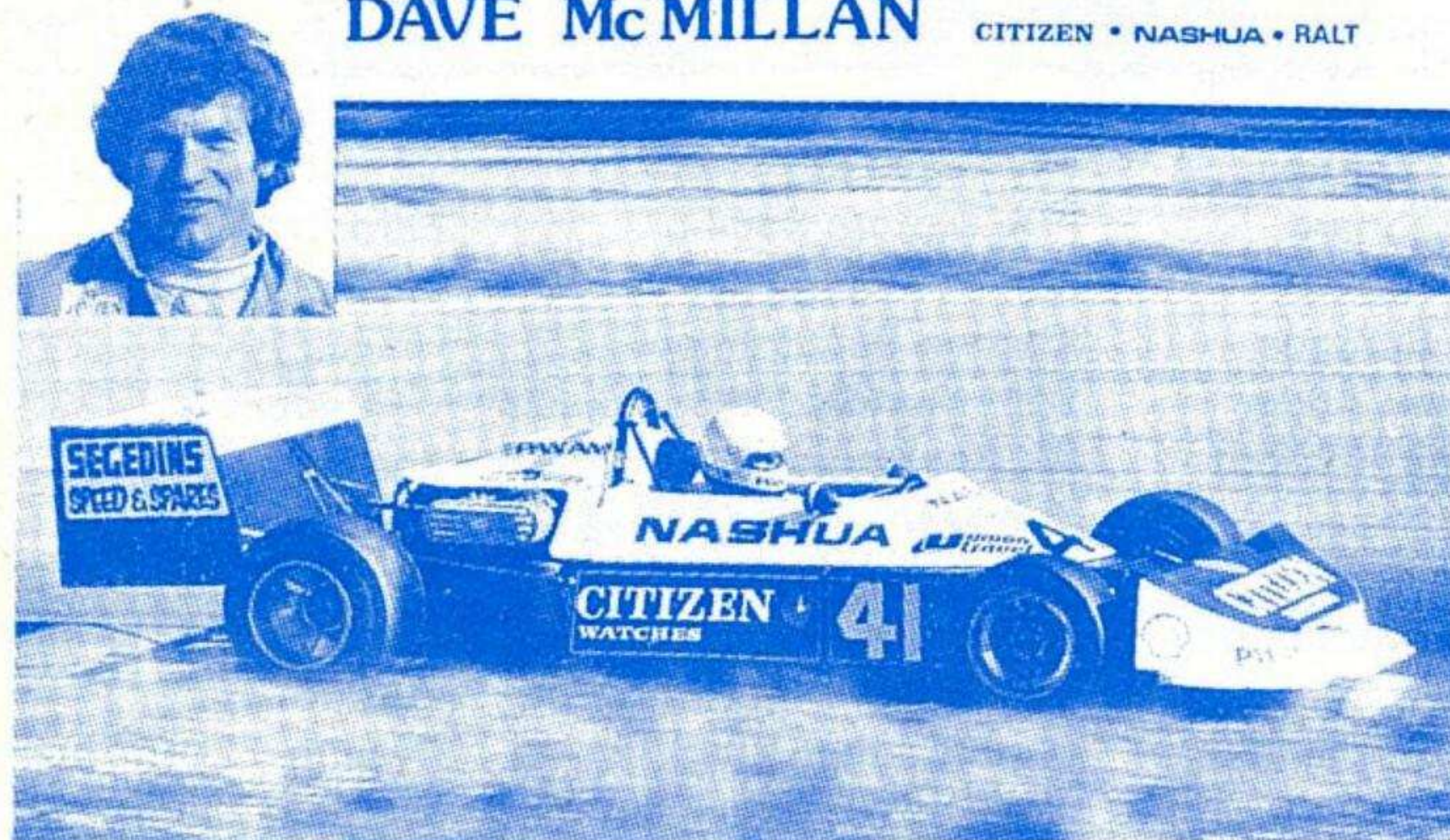

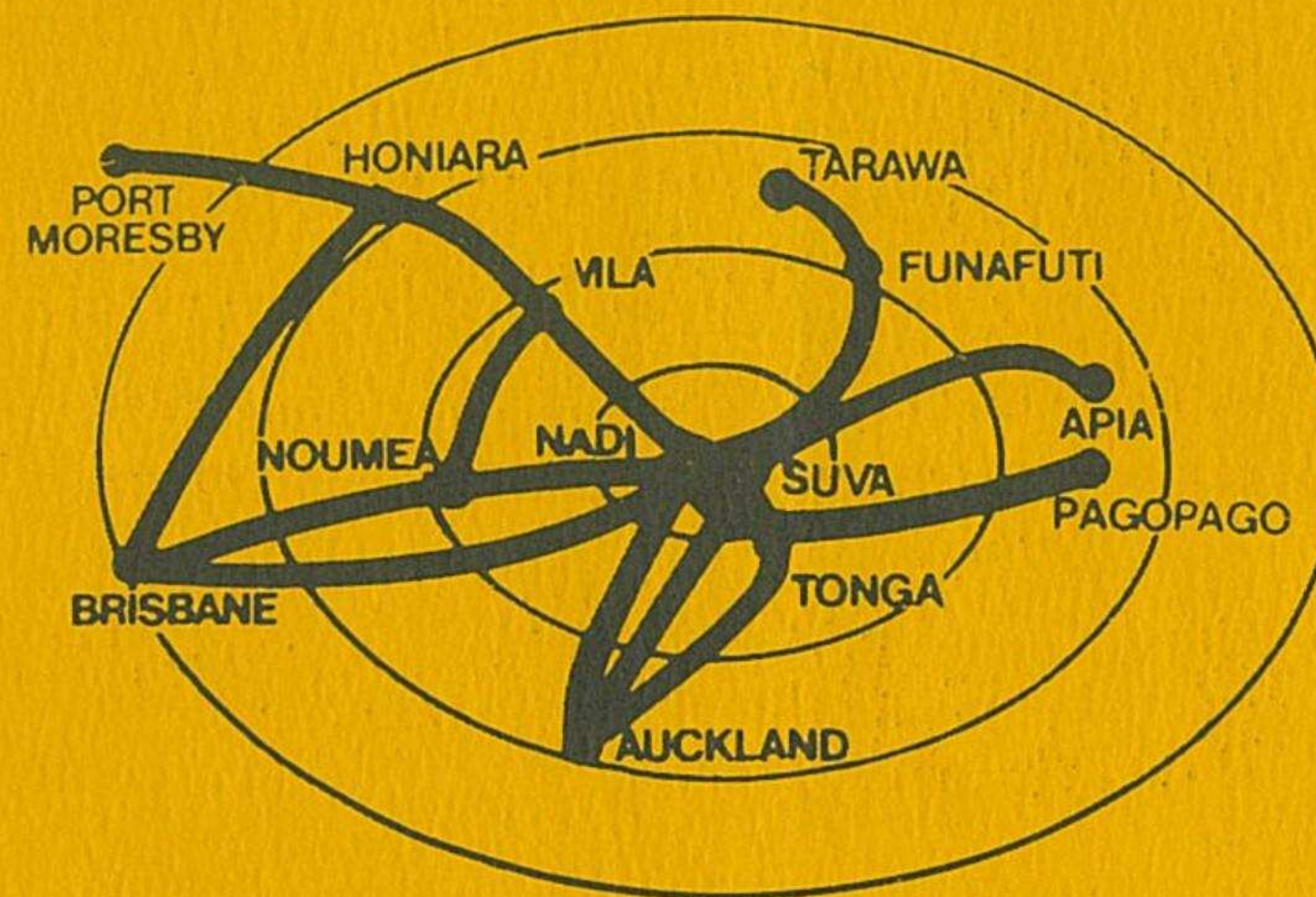
