#### ANNOUNCEMENT AND JURISDICTION.

The Chelmsford and District Auto Club, hereinafter called the Organisers, will hold for Solo and Sidecar Motor Cycles, a restricted Road Race Meeting. Restricted to Eastern Centre, South Midland Centre, South Eastern Centre and the British Motor Cycling Racing Club.

#### COURSE AND RACES.

The Course is a flat 3 mile circuit, in good condition, average width 50ft., of tarmacadam surface with right and left bends in good condition.

#### EVENTS.

- 1. Lightweight. 8 laps, for 200 to 250 c.c. Solo
- 2. Junior. 10 laps, Scratch Race for 251 to 350 c.c. Solo Motor Cycles.
- Senior. 10 laps, Scratch Race for 351 to 500 c.c. Solo Motor Cycles.
- 4. Chelmsford 100. 33 laps, limited 1000 c.c. Solo
- 5. Sidecar. 10 laps Scratch Race, unlimited c.c.
- 6. Vintage Race. 4 laps Solo

#### AWARDS.

For an entry of 30 ... Down to 7th place.

For an entry of 20-25 ... Down to 6th place.

Junior-First, £15; Second, £10; Third, £5; Fourth to Seventh, £1 10s. od. (Event 2).

Lightweight—First, £10; Second, £5; Third, £2 10s. od.; Fourth to Seventh, £1. (Event 1).

Senior - First, £15; Second, £10; Third, £5; Fourth to Seventh, £1 tos. od. (Event 3).

Chelmsford 100-First, £30; Second, £15; Third, £10; Fourth, £5; Fifth to Eighth, £2 10s. od. (Event 4).

Sidecar—First, £15; Second, £10; Third, £5; Fourth to Seventh, £1 (Event 5).

#### MACHINES.

The same machine must be used throughout any ONE EVENT. Both during practice and racing the whole of the exhaust gasses shall pass through a pipe or pipes which shall not be perforated, and shall terminate at a point lying between the two vertical transverse planes containing the rear wheel with tyre. The gasses shall not be discharged so as to raise dust, blow on the ground, or to affect other drivers. All joints shall be permanent and tight.

Any provision for the discharge of waste or surplus oil shall be so made that the oil does not get into the exhaust gas stream, or in any way inconvenience a following driver. All competing machines must be equipped with mudguards which project beyond the tyre on each side and covering 100 degrees of the circumference of the front wheel and 160 degrees of the circumference of the rear wheel. Equipment which must be removed include lamps, horns, lighting equipment, including wiring harness, dynamo, unless the machine is fitted with coil ignition. Front, rear and prop stands, except when the front stand forms a stay for the mudguard it may be retained, but must be wired up securely. Central stands will be permitted providing they are wired up securely. Registration plates and licence holders.

All motor cycles will be examined before the start of the race to ensure that they are in a safe and sound condition, and comply with the requirements of these Regulations.

The Cubic capacity of Motor Cycles shall be in accordance with the capacity specified for the Race.

# CHANGE OF MACHINE OR NOMINATION OF A SUBSTITUTE DRIVER.

An entry of a particular make of Motor Cycle, and, or a nominated Driver having been made and accepted, no change in the make of Motor Cycle or nominated Driver shall be permitted unless submitted to the Stewards of the Meeting through the Secretary before 8.0 a.m. on Saturday, 2nd September, 1950.

#### PRACTISING.

Each Competitor to complete at least four Practise Laps to qualify for any one event.
