

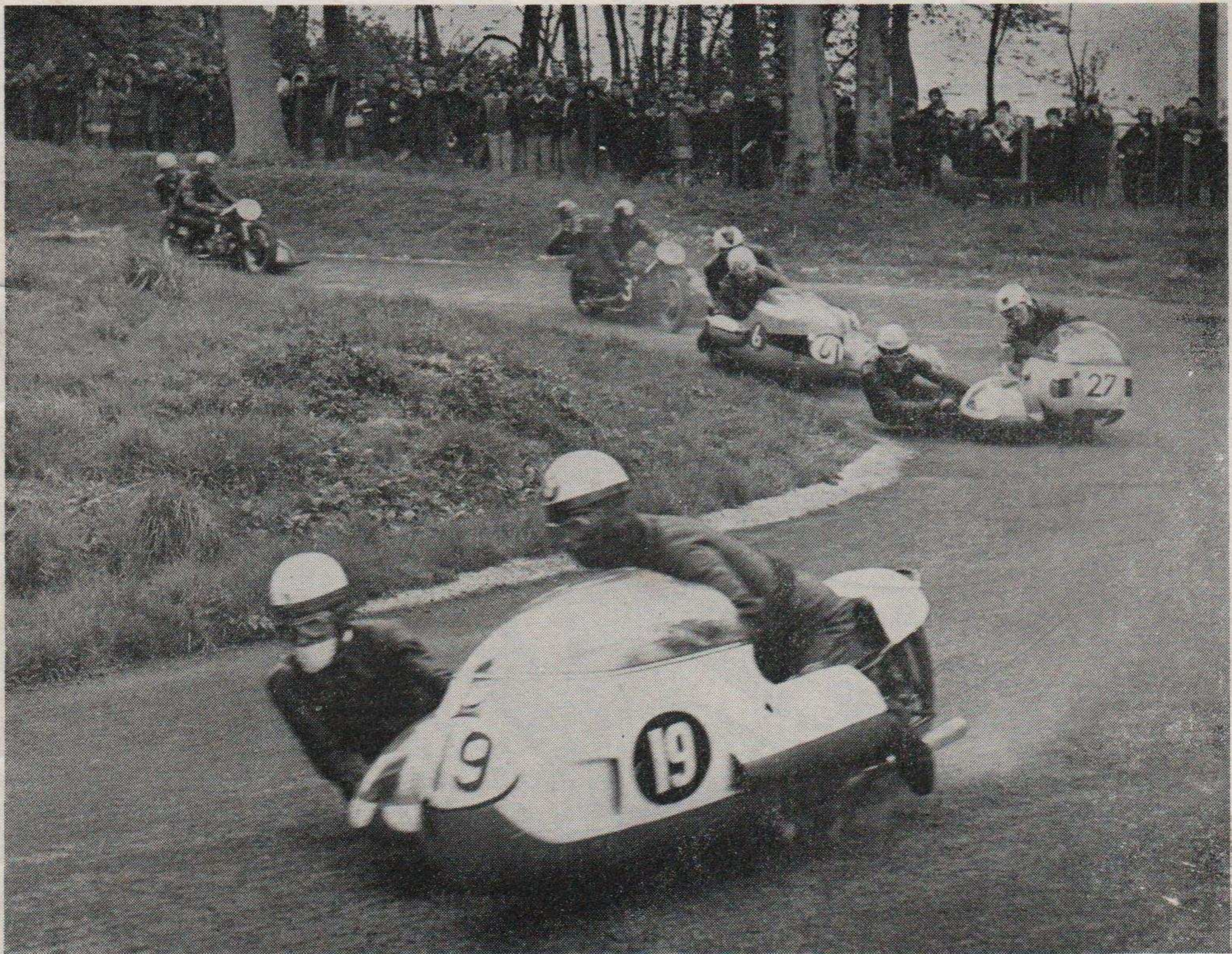

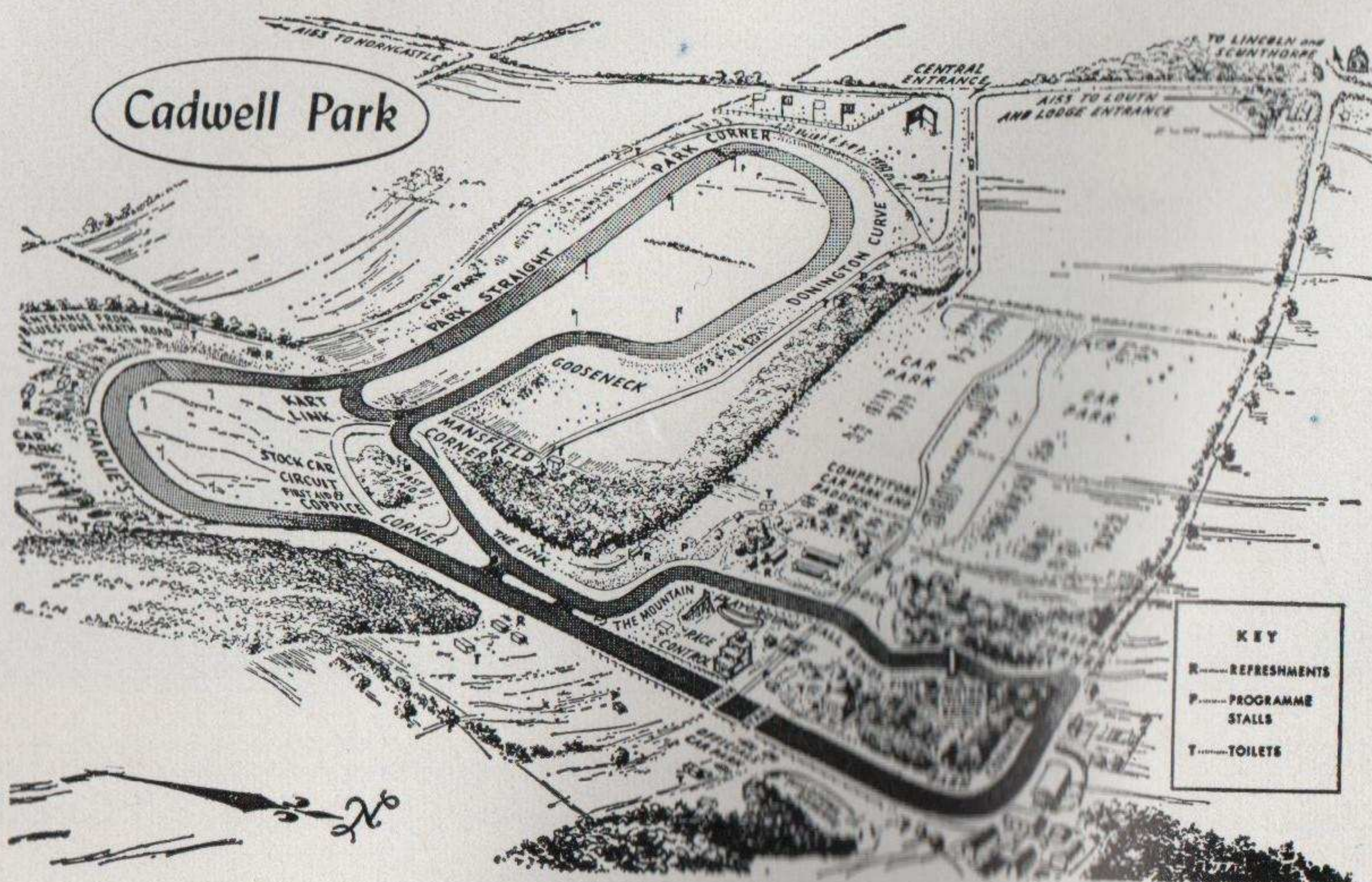

The "Avenger"

Twelve Times World Champion, Italian Giacomo Agostini again returns to this circuit which he enjoys "because it is difficult and has much challenge". He will be out to avenge last year's defeat in the 350 cc Races in May and September—and 1,000 cc in May; this time he brings the new 4 cylinder junior machine instead of the 3 cylinder. One thing is certain—he will have to keep his 'skates' on to keep in front of Derek Chatterton who beat him in the 350 and 1,000 cc races last year, and this year's most promising British rider Mick Grant, and a few others—how about Ken Redfern, Dave Croxford, Tony Rutter and Brian Kemp with the Work's Yamaha he has just bought from Rod Gould?

Norman Hanks has twice this year broken the Circuit Lap Record, so Chris Vincent will have to travel much faster than ever before to take a Sidecar win—for which he has the ability and an exceedingly fast machine in the 4 cylinder German Munch-Mamuth. For other possible winners look to Brian Rust, Mick Boddice, Switzerland's Rudi Kurth, Tony Wakefield and Graham Milton.

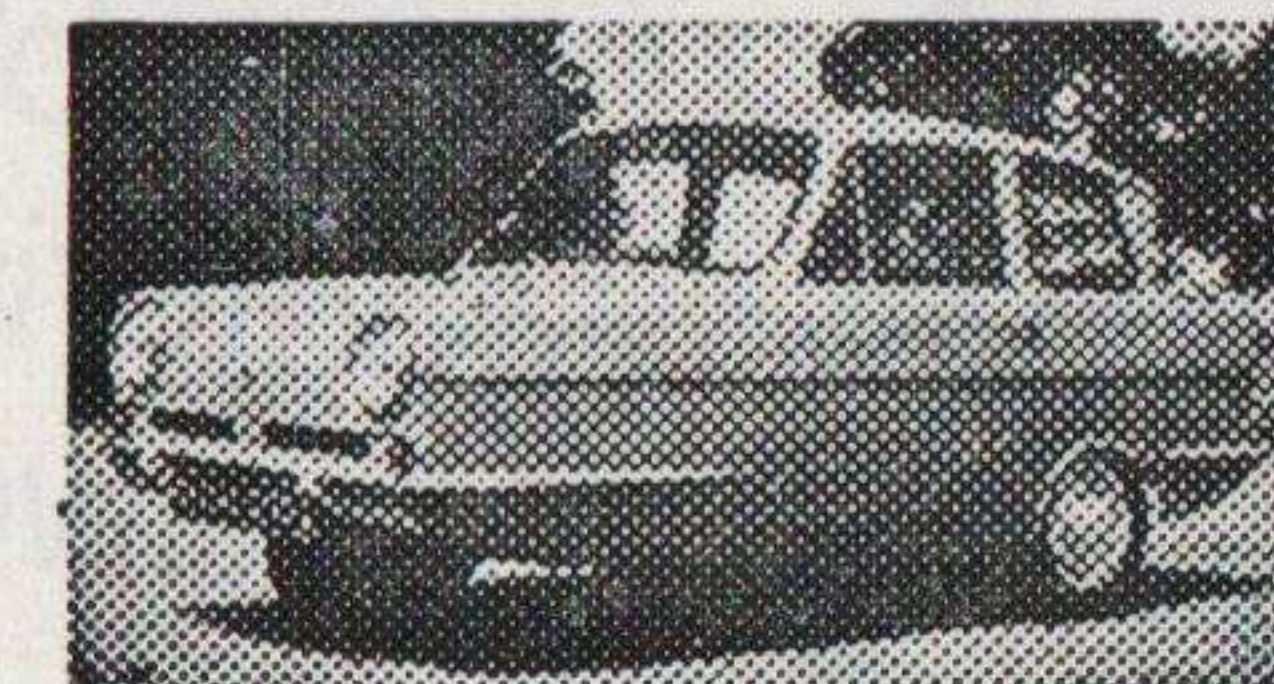

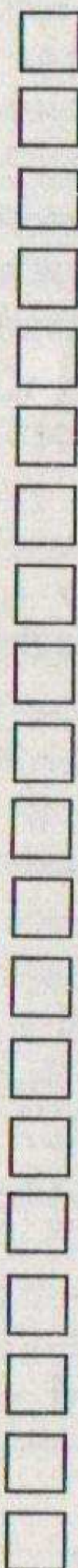

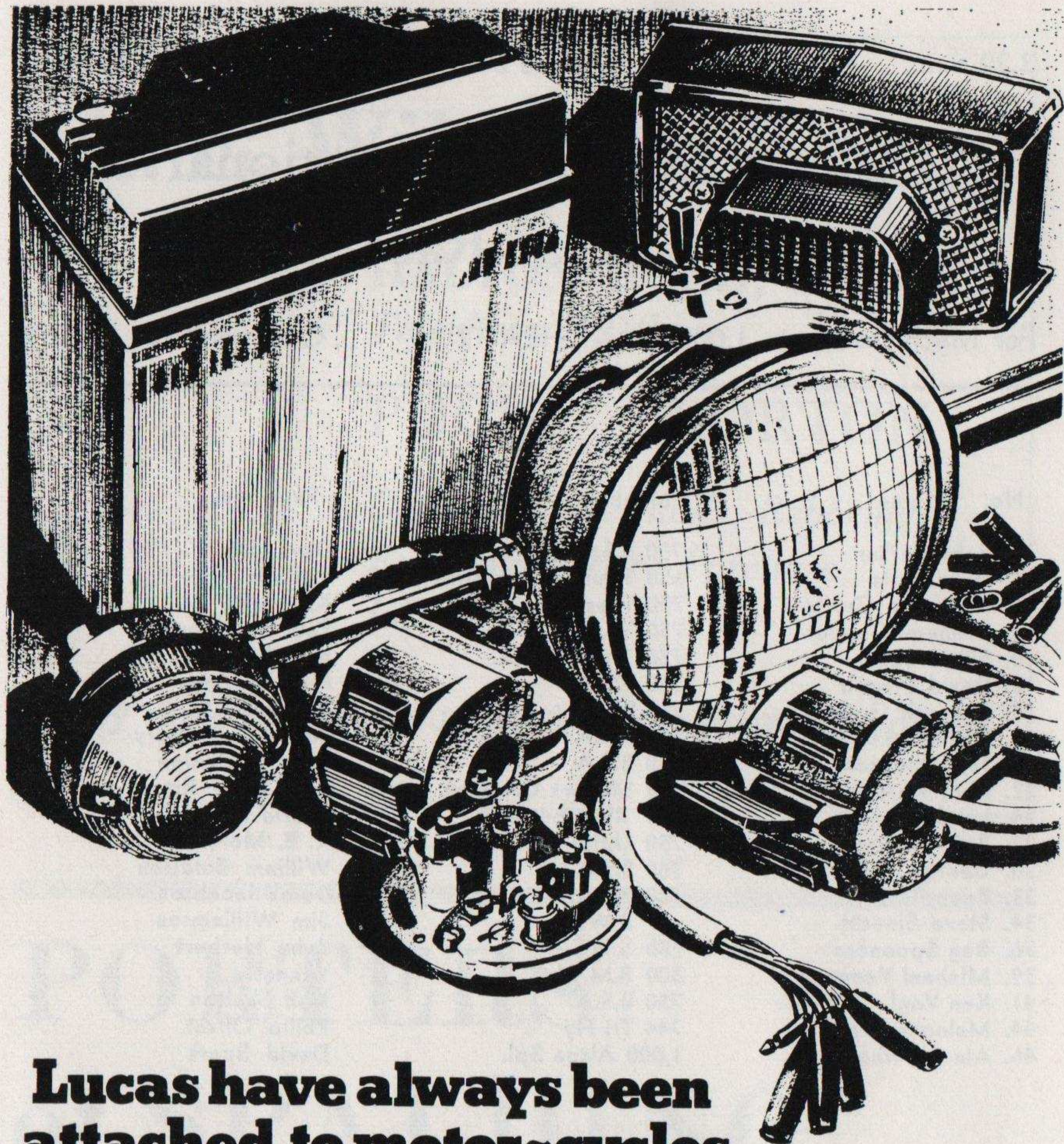
