10.-REFUSAL OF ENTRIES.

The promoters reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason for so doing and also reserve the right to refuse permission to start any car they deem unsafe or unsuitable. The promoters reserve the right to postpone or cancel the meeting. Entry fees may be returned in full if the meeting is cancelled or postponed more than 24 hours.

11.—SCRUTINEER.

The Scrutineer shall have the power to transfer any entry into a different class. No car will be allowed to start unless it has a "pass" label affixed by the Scrutineer. Scrutineering will be carried out in the Paddock.

12.—PROHIBITION OF PRACTICE.

Competitors must on no account practice on the course, nor on any of the roads of the estate.

13.—PADDOCK ARRANGEMENTS.

The Competitors' Paddock will be at the top of the hill. A "one-way-traffic" system will be in force, the course being "up," the return road "down." On arrival competitors are requested to proceed slowly up the course to the paddock as the course may be obstructed by Officials laying the timing cable. Competitors will be sent from paddock to start a few minutes before they are to run, and must obey the instructions of the Paddock Marshal in this respect. This new paddock is intended to obviate the usual congestion at the foot of the hill, and the organisers hope that the meeting will be run more expeditiously as a result. Competitors are asked to co-operate by obeying the instructions of the Paddock Marshal, and by not stopping on the "one-way" roads.

14. - TIMING.

The Club's Electrical Timing System, recording to 1/100 second, will be used.

15.—INSURANCE.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS.

1.—ORGANISATION.

The meeting is organised by the Vintage Sports-Car Club and is open by invitation to members of the Bugatti Owners' Club, The Chiltern Car Club, The Frazer-Nash B.M.W. Car Club, The Junior Car Club, and The United Hospitals Club.

2.—ENTRIES.

All Entries must be made on the official entry form and must reach the Secretary of the Meeting, Miss M. Choate, Egarston, Park Lane, Basingstoke, Hants, not later than first post on Monday, July 10th, 1939. All entries must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Cheques should be made out to the Vintage Sports-Car Club.

3.—TIME OF START.

The start will be at 2 p.m. and all competitors must report by 10 p.m.

4.—CLASSES.

5.—ENTRY FEES.

Driving Members and Competing Associate Members of the promoting Club: Classes I-9, first entry 8/6. Additional entries 5/-. Allcomers' Class 12/6.

Members of the invited clubs:

Classes I-6, first entry 12/6. Additional entries 10/-.

Allcomers' Class 15/-

6.—ORDER OF RUNNING.

Each car entered in the Sports, Super-sports, Racing, Veteran or Consistency Classes will have TWO RUNS ONLY, the fastest time to count for all classes entered except the Allcomers' Class. Cars entered in the Allcomers' Class will have one run (in addition to the above) of which the time will count in the Allcomers' Class only. Cars entered only in the Allcomers' Class will be allowed one run only.

Cars will be run as far as possible in the following order:-

Sports Cars First runs Sports Cars Second runs Super-sports Cars First runs Super-sports Cars Second runs Veteran Cars First runs Veteran Cars Second runs Racing Cars First runs Racing Cars Second runs ... Allcomers Class one run each ...

In each section cars will run in numerical order, subject to any over-riding instructions by the Officials.

7.—ELIGIBILITY.

Cars may only be entered in there own capacity class, but sports cars may also enter in the super-sports and racing class for the same capacity cars. Super sports cars may also be entered in the racing class. Any capacity car may be entered for the Allcomers class.

Entrants must state on their entry forms if their cars are eligible for Vintage and/or Special awards.

All entrants and drivers must be members of the promoting Club or of the invited Clubs.

Entrants are reminded that a Vintage car is one manufactured prior to 1931, and that the Vintage awards are open only to driving members of the promoting club driving Vintage cars.

The Veteran Class will be run on a handicap basis, and is

open to cars manufactured prior to December 31st. 1915.

Cars entered in the Ladies' and Allcomers' classes may run stripped.

8.-SPORTS AND SUPER-SPORTS CARS.

The term "Sports Car" denotes an unsupercharged car originally built as a sports or touring model and not materially altered. Neither the engine nor chassis may have won an award in an Open speed event in the hands of the present owner.

The super-sports car is one originally constructed or subse-

quently modified for competition use.

Sports and super-sports cars must be suitable for, and have been regularly used on the road, and must carry hood, lamps, windscreen, battery, and spare wheel.

Supercharged cars conforming to this regulation are eligible

for the super-sports classes.

No fuel other than that normally supplied to the public may be used in these classes, (Benzole may be mixed with the fuel up to 50%).

9.—AWARDS.

Consistency Class.

A special award will be given to the driver whose times in his two runs show least percentage variation. In the event of a tie a third run will be given and the competitor showing the least variation over the three runs will be the winner.
