MoS₂ AND ALL THAT

How many people—as they add Moly-slip to their engine oil—pause to think of the romantic circumstances that surrounded its invention?

It all happened many years ago, long before Graham was even a slight slope, let alone a Hill. One winter's evening in Darkest West Kensington, MoS₂, ace secret agent of the dreaded C.S.I. This is a live, active club, and does, we feel, offer the Snetterton race-goer excellent value for his £1 or 30s., whichever the case may be; our steadily increasing membership does, I think, verify this.
